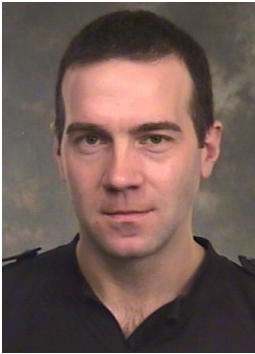

## Message from Inspector Ed Brown

## Crime Updates (1st to 30th June 2019)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	2	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	2	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	1	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Norfolk Constabulary are trialling "Nextdoor", a social networking service for neighbourhoods to report local issues and concerns directly to the communities involved. As part of our trial we will this month be sharing our Parish Cluster Newsletters via Nextdoor.

Nextdoor is the world's largest neighbourhood website and app. Nextdoor enables truly local conversations that empower neighbours to build stronger, safer and happier communities.

People are using Nextdoor to: spread the word about a lost dog, organise a Neighbourhood Watch Group, find a trustworthy babysitter, find a new home for an outgrown bike, etc.

People are naturally suspicious when they receive an invitation to sign up via the website [www.nextdoor.co.uk](http://www.nextdoor.co.uk) but Nextdoor have confirmed that these are perfectly legitimate invitations from neighbours and if you have any concerns the help section on their website outlines more about these invitations.

## Neighbourhood Priorities

The following priorities were agreed at the Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) Priority Setting Meeting held at Wells Police Station on Thursday 6th June 2019:

1. Parking - Monitor obstructive vehicle parking across the area during the peak season
2. Speeding - Monitor speeding across the area, check in areas that have regular speeding issues.
