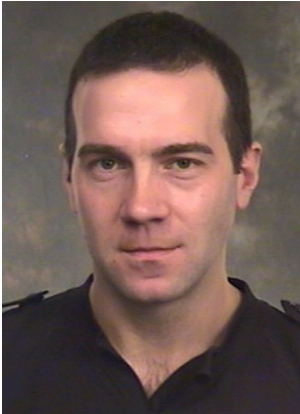

## Message from you local Inspector, Ed Brown

It's been an extremely busy Summer for us as North Norfolk tends to come alive with visitors flocking to the area to enjoy what we know is an outstanding place to live and work. As much as we welcome those visitors it does bring increased demands not least providing support for the large number of public events.

We continue to be one of the safest places in the country but policing in North Norfolk is about so much more than crime. Our officers spend many hours looking for missing people, dealing with road traffic incidents and providing support for vulnerable people with challenging mental health issues. If all we had to deal with was crime our work would be so much more straightforward.

Communities continue to tell us that what they want to see is more visible policing across the area. Whilst more new bobbies may be on the way over the next 12 months we do have a really good team here in North Norfolk already and part of my role is getting them out and about into our community more and I shall be focussing on that again over the coming months. We can't be everywhere but we will be somewhere!

## Crime Updates (1st to 31st August 2019)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Over the last week, some areas in the district have seen an increase in thefts from vehicles. Whilst we are lucky enough to live in a safe area, we still recommend that unattended vehicles are kept locked and all valuables either removed or secured out of sight.

- Check your vehicles
- Shut your windows
- Lock your doors
- Check your outbuildings

We know that some criminals are opportunist's looking for a quick and easy win, by carrying out these daily checks you can reduce crime and protect your property.

### Neighbourhood Priorities

Current SNAP (Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel) Priorities for Wells and surrounding parishes:

1. **Parking** - Monitor obstructive vehicle parking across the area during the peak season.
2. **Speeding** - Monitor speeding across the area, check in areas that have regular speeding issues.
3. **Anti-Social Behaviour** – Wells Skate Park.
